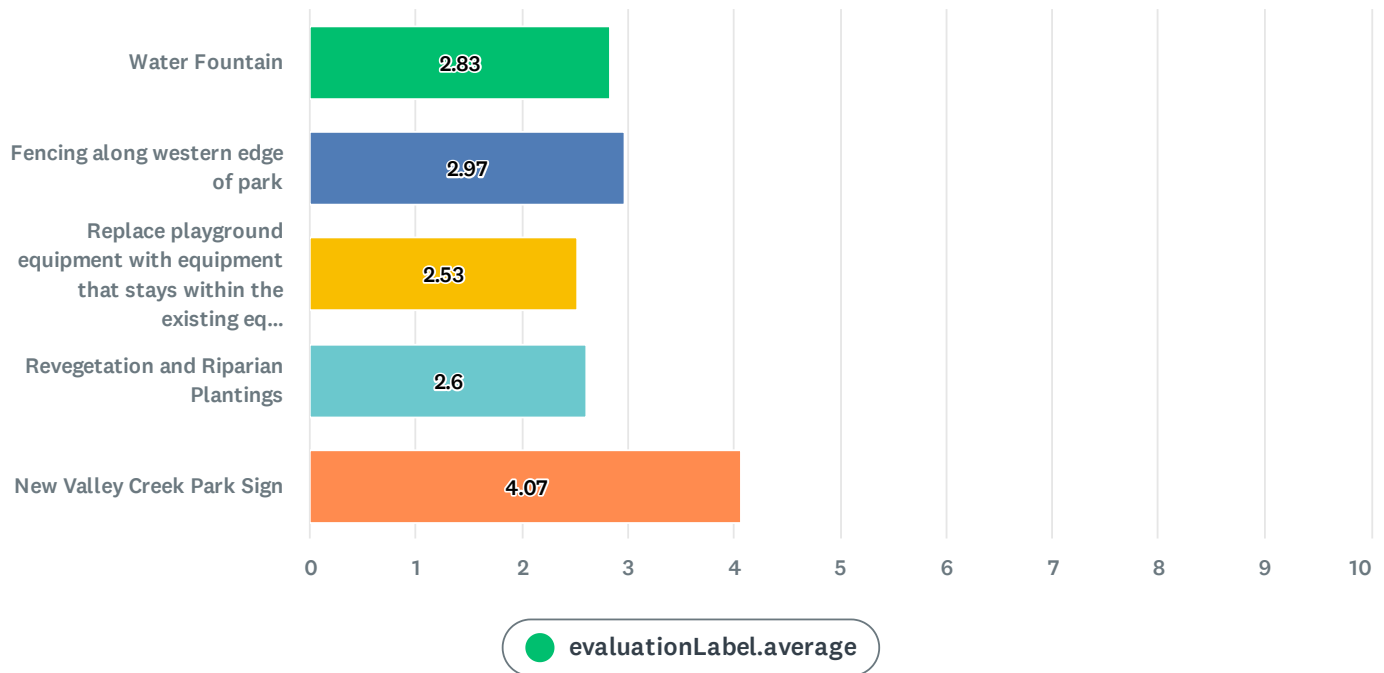


Q1 30 responses

*Numbers closest to one are the most highly recommended items.

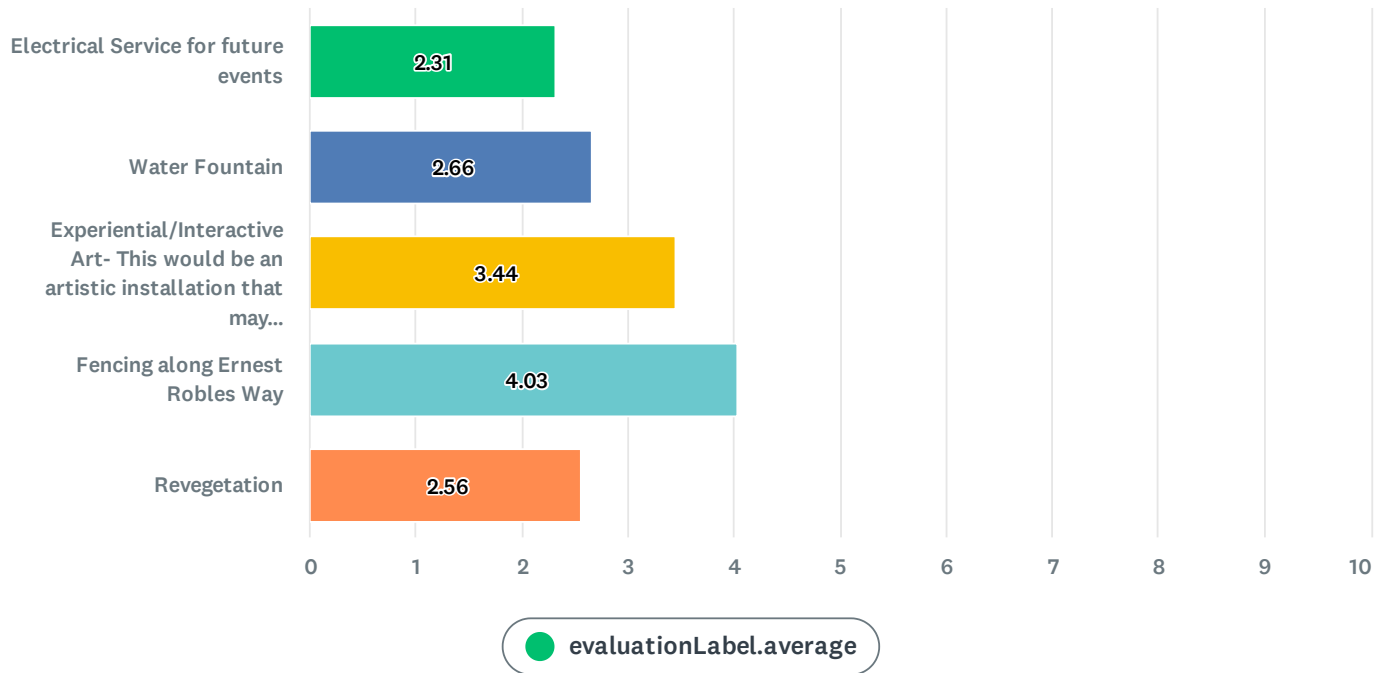

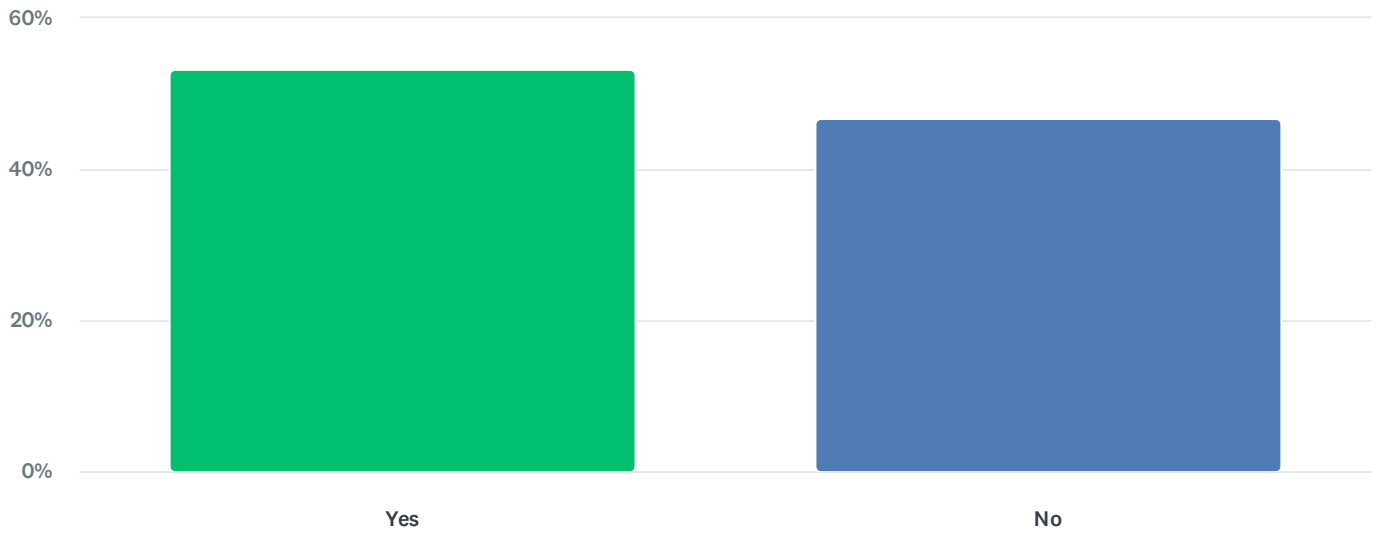

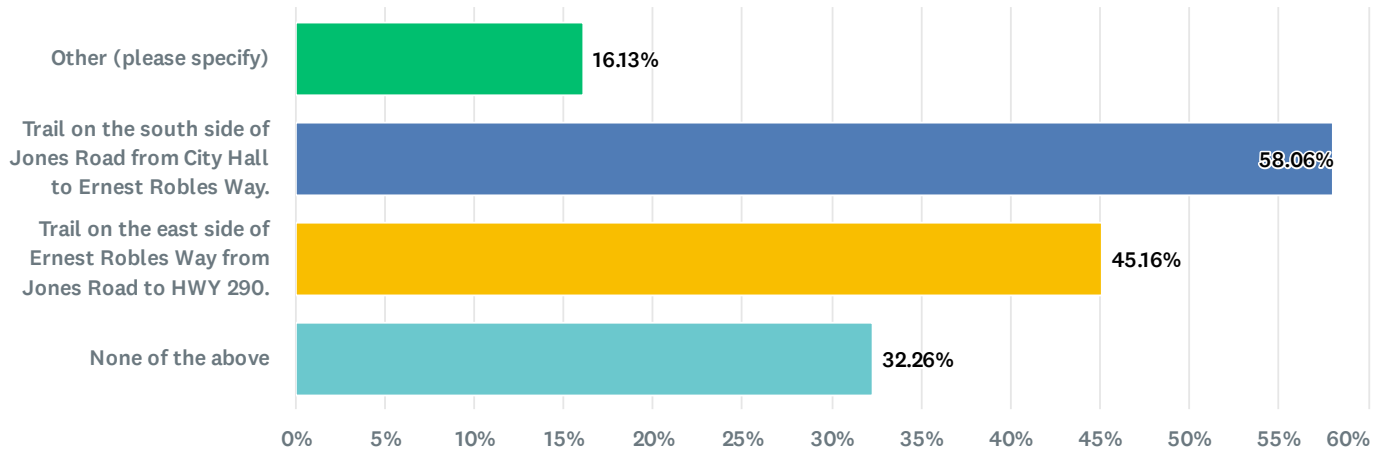
